

# Six Syllable Patterns

1. One vowel followed by a consonant will make its short sound: hat.

2. One vowel at the end of a word or syllable will say its name: me.

3. When a vowel is separated from a silent letter *e* at the end of the word by at least one consonant, the first vowel will say its name: makee.

4. Two vowels come together and the first vowel says its name: praya.

5. A vowel when followed by the letter *r* usually forms a team with the letter *r* and makes a special sound: cara.

6. Two vowels come together, and the first vowel does not say its name: joyo.
